18/19 MID YEAR REVIEW

Bringing you news and updates about the Cocoa Horizons Program from around the world.

The Cocoa Horizons Foundation's mission is to improve the livelihoods of cocoa farmers and their communities through the promotion of sustainable, entrepreneurial farming, improved productivity and community development.

This snapshot includes mid-year* updates for three of our partner countries - Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana and Cameroon. Our program in Tanzania is run as a special project and is not included in this report.

SCALING IMPACT AND DRIVING CHANGE THROUGH PRODUCTIVITY AND COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES



THE COCOA HORIZONS PROGRAM COVERS:



- Farmer Group and Group Member requirements;
- Traceability of cocoa from farmer to Barry Callebaut buying site;
- Farmer Group and Farmer Training;
- Activities that target the cocoa productivity and production;
- Activities that target community development; and
- Transparency of premium flows.



FARMER GROUP AND GROUP MEMBER REQUIREMENTS:

100% of farmer groups respect and sign:

- 85 farmer groups (18 new this year) delivered Horizons cocoa.
- Of the 106,655 Cocoa Horizons registered farmers, 65,443 actively delivered Horizons cocoa thus far this year:

- ➔  19,598 in Côte d'Ivoire
- ➔  42,154 in Ghana
- ➔  3,691 in Cameroon

TRACEABILITY OF COCOA:

- **73,994 MT** of Horizons cocoa beans delivered.
- ➔  **25,478 MT** in Côte d'Ivoire
- ➔  **40,000 MT** in Ghana
- ➔  **8,516 MT** in Cameroon
- All Horizons cocoa is traced from farmer to first Barry Callebaut buying sites. From there, it is traced following mass balance principles.



FARMER GROUP AND FARMER TRAINING:





The Cocoa Horizons training curriculum was expanded to better achieve productivity impacts, including two new modules on environmental protection and human rights, to take place in May and June this year

- **49,394** farmers trained
- ➔  **24,894** in Côte d'Ivoire
- ➔  **24,500** in Ghana
- **113** Farmer Trainers were accredited, bringing total to **488**
- ➔  **50** in Côte d'Ivoire
- ➔  **38** in Ghana
- ➔  **25** in Cameroon



PRODUCTIVITY



- **3,951** farmer group members had access to productivity packages (coaching, inputs such as tools and seedlings, or finance)
- ➔  **3,457** in Côte d'Ivoire
- ➔  **494** in Cameroon
- **40** community professionals accredited in a specialty (pruners, nurserists, sprayers).
- **145** Demonstration Plots in Côte d'Ivoire and Ghana
- **73,484** farms mapped, **47%** of total registered members of Cocoa Horizons have at least one farm mapped.



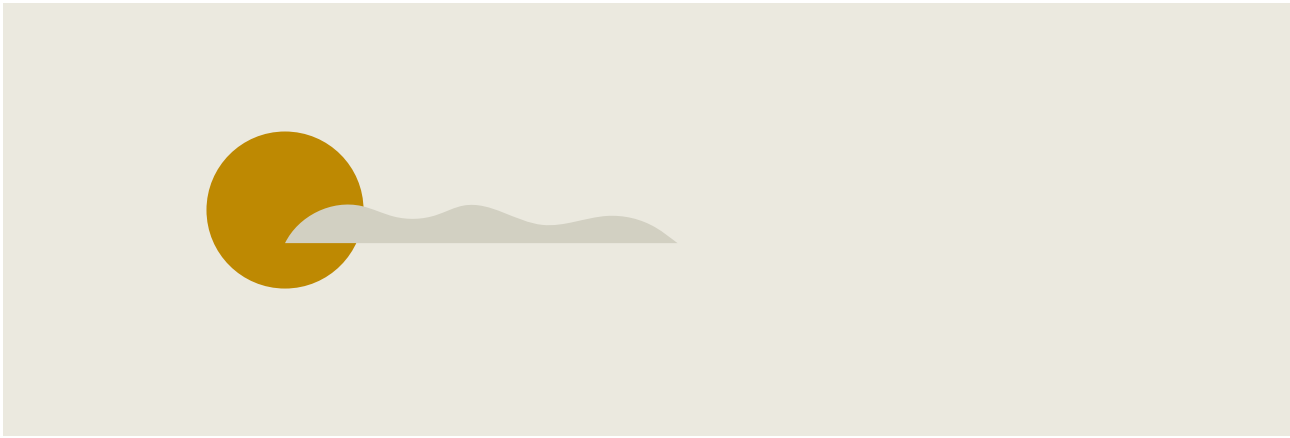
COMMUNITY:

- 4,291 community members sensitized on child labor in Côte d'Ivoire.
- 13 communities in Côte d'Ivoire reached by the Cocoa Horizons truck.



Child Labor Monitoring and Remediation System - Côte d'Ivoire and Ghana

- 11,785 farmers and household members participated in CLMRS interviews.
- 32 Farmer organisations are covered by CLMRS or equivalent.
- 1,530 school kits distributed.





Women's Empowerment

- 20,236 women are Cocoa Horizons registered farmers, approximately 19% of total.

- ➔  3,774 in Côte d'Ivoire
- ➔  16,054 in Ghana
- ➔  408 in Cameroon

- 198 women are in governance positions within Cocoa Horizons Farmer Groups.

- ➔  90 in Côte d'Ivoire
- ➔  108 in Ghana
